### MONEY LAUNDERING (1 punto)

1. **Placement:** the money gets into the financial system  
**Layering:** The money is moved around / Criminals try to hide the source of the funds  
**Integration:** The money is put back into the system (as legitimate)
2. Cash / property / shares / cars / antiques / art / proceeds from fraud or bribery
3. (If you work in financial or banking services) you have to report to your money laundering reporting officer / nominated officer  
(If you don't work in financial services) there's a customer's hotline open to anyone
4. - Multiple small cash deposits in different places to avoid suspicion / smurfing  
- Large cash deposits  
- Businesses that want to be paid in cash (they mix these funds with legitimate funds)  
- Payments from offshore bank accounts (especially from countries with relaxed legislation)  
- Cancellations or returns where the customer pays in cash but asks for a refund by cheque (and shows no concerns for cancellation fees or penalties).  
- (Funds that go to) personal accounts (which are suspicious) without normal outgoing expenses, such as utility bills, payments to supermarkets, cash withdrawals.

### THE FUTURE OF SHOPPING (1 punto)

1. -They enhance store experience.  
-Retailers can gather data on your movements and can push content to your device.  
-They can gather data to better segment customers and advertise accordingly.
